



Mr. Charles Timothy Talbert

August 17, 1964 - November 17, 2024

A native of Mobile, Alabama, "Tim" passed away peacefully, surrounded by his family, on November 17, 2024, at USA Health Providence Hospital after suffering a sudden massive cardiac arrest.

He is survived by his wife of 34 years, Lana D. Talbert; cherished grandson Jackson Taylor McDavid; sisters Amelia Yokley and Shelia Newton (Paul); sister-in-law, Susan Talbert; and a host of nephews and nieces.

Tim went on to serve for nine years with the Seven Hills Fire District, where he was not only a volunteer firefighter and First Responder but also served as Captain and later as a member of the Board. His beloved German shepherd, Jake, was also a member of the fire department. Tim considered his fellow firefighters his second family, and his dedication to the department was unwavering.
