“ *Obituary for Chester (Chet) Issac Davis*

Chester Davis, 90, a recent resident of Mobile, Ala., died on July 2, 2022. Mr. Davis died of a broken heart 21 days after his beloved wife, Phyllis, died.

Mr. Davis was born in Henley, Hays County, Texas, on November 5, 1931, to James Allen Davis, Sr., and Trudy Viola Felps Davis.

Chester was married to his first wife, Shirley (Mo) Mozelle Baker Davis, for 53 years before she died from complications of COPD, on July 4, 2001.

Chet was married to his second wife, Phyllis J. Davis, for 20 years before she died from complications of pancreatic cancer, on June 11, 2022.

Mr. Davis attended Johnson City High School in Johnson City, Texas, and the University of Alaska. He worked as a Fire Fighter/Paramedic for the Austin, Texas FD, the Anchorage, Alaska FD, and the Nikiski, Alaska FD. After retiring as Chief, Chet served on the Board of Directors for the Nikiski FD until retiring again. After retiring, he volunteered delivering meals-on-wheels for many years.

Chet was an avid golfer, prankster, joke teller and enjoyed a hearty laugh, country music and especially “fiddle” music.

Chester was preceded in death by his two wives; his parents; his two sisters, Ruby Lee Davis Pfullman and Willie Rae Davis Herwig; his brother, James Allen Davis, Jr.; and two daughters, Carol and Wanda Davis.
