In the early years Keith attended Hollinger's Island Elementary School and also attended Palmer Pillans middle school. Keith's family traveled a lot because his father was in the military and worked as a Calibration Technician. They lived in Enterprise, Alabama and also Homestead, Alabama just to name a few

One of Keith's fondest memories was spending time with his dad watching him work on his cars or electrical equipment. He prided himself in learning from his father how to fix things. Keith's hobbies were working on cars, motorcycle riding and talking on the CB radio.

Keith was a member of Hollinger's Island Baptist Church where his "mother and father attended."

Keith's life as a young man was troubled and he found himself in trouble many times, some may have deemed him impossible to love or deal with at times. But God, who is rich in mercy, for his great love where with he loved us, even when we were dead in sins; and it is by his grace that we are saved.

In 1995, God gave Keith a new lease on life and he moved to San Francisco, California to start over. He found himself in the Tenderloin District and shortly thereafter worked with the homeless population.

He got a job working as a monitor at Next Door Shelter and began to service that population of people. Keith also drove the MAP van transporting the homeless to various shelters throughout San Francisco.

He worked in Berkeley, California as a Case Manager at BOSS (Building Opportunities for Self Sufficiency), and also as an AOD Counselor at Walden House residential drug treatment program.

On August 25, 1996 Keith met "Betty Sanford". He walked up "to her and said you're going to be my wife". She looked at him smiled and said I don't know who you think you're talking to.

From that day forward Keith pursued her and the rest is history. On May 17, 1997 they were married at the Cosmopolitan Missionary Baptist Church, in San Francisco, California by Rev. Dr. Alfred Ray Gentle, Emeritus. Keith was ordained as a deacon in 1998 by Reverend Gentle and he served at Cosmopolitan In that capacity and also as a choir member.

Keith loved to sing and he loved quartet gospel music and he became a member of the American Singers Association of the Bay Area. Keith also loved to tell jokes and have fun, he enjoyed making people laugh.

Keith is preceded in death by his sister, Sharon Anderson McLean, his mother Martha Anderson Meyer, and father Louis Andrew Meyer.

He is survived by his loving wife Betty Jo Meyer, his uncle Billy Ray Anderson and aunt Iris Anderson, aunt Frances Wright. nephews Michael and Adam McLean, and a host of loving cousins and friends.

After the death of his father, Keith and Betty moved from Oakland, CA to Mobile in October 2013. Shortly after that they became members of the Right Way Christian Center Church under the Leadership of Dr Vincent and Pastor Mishondia Robinson.
