



## Mr. Travis Lamar Hall

January 22, 1960 - March 24, 2022

Travis Lamar Hall was born January 22, 1960 in Mobile, Alabama. He passed away from cancer on March 24, 2022, at home surrounded by family. Travis is survived by a large and loving family: his children, Garret Hall and Savannah Hall; five siblings: Jack Hall, Jr., Jimmy (Karen) Hall, Donna (Stan) Foster, Cindy (Buddy) McQuillen, and Susie (Errol) Hewitt; as well as many beloved nieces, nephews, cousins, and other relatives. Travis had numerous cherished friends, including life-long friends who visited him during his final weeks, bringing food, love, and laughter. He was preceded in death by his parents, Jack and LaVera Hall.

Travis developed a love of wood and woodworking at an early age from his father and had a successful career in the lumber business, primarily in lumber export. His first job was at Wigman's Hardware, later having a long tenure at Klumb Lumber, where he was a top salesman. His territory included much of the Caribbean.

Travis never met a stranger. His larger-than-life personality and sense of humor, as well as his genuine love of people, brought him friends from all walks of life. He loved music and was the number one Wet Willie fan. One of his fondest memories was being invited to tour with the band during the summer when he was 15, being watched over by Jimmy, Jack and Donna. What an adventure! Travis also enjoyed playing Ultimate Frisbee, and gained

lots of friends through the game. He loved being on the water, and spent many years living on Dog River.

There will be an outdoor Celebration of Life on April 10 at 3:00pm on his beloved Dog River, at the Dan de Lion Lodge, 2411 Venetia Road, Mobile, AL 36605.
